

## CURRICULUM INFORMATION RECORD

Subject: Religion Grades: 6

<p>Objectives: Old Testament – Bible studies Students will have a basic understanding of the Hebrew Scriptures/Old Testament including The Pentateuch, creation, Moses and the Ten Commandments, the historical books, the prophetic books and the wisdom books.</p> <p>Chapters: Depending on the text, approximately 2/3 of the book, or 16/24 chapters.</p> <p>Technology: In addition to using the computers for research and word processing, students could produce a newspaper using Publisher as a final product for the study. SmartBoard, Discourse if available.</p>	<p>Objectives: New Testament – Bible studies. Students will discover how Jesus was a student of the Old Testament, and how He fulfills the Covenants made in the Old Testament.</p> <p>Chapters: Depending on the text, approximately 1/6 of the book (4/24 chapters).</p> <p>Technology: Internet research, word processing, SmartBoard integration if available. Discourse software if available.</p>	<p>Objectives – Sacramental Review – students will review Sacramental signs, symbols and rituals as Jesus Christ established.</p> <p>Chapters: Depending on the text, approximately 1/6 of the book (4/24 chapters).</p> <p>Technology: Internet research, word processing, SmartBoard integration if available. Discourse software if available.</p>
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Faith Integration/ Catholic Identity: scripture reveals God to us, nature of covenant, how the Old Testament points us to Jesus, understanding the Mass

Resources and Materials: *Christ Jesus, Our Way* (Benziger) or *Christ Our Life* (Loyola Press). Supplementary materials on the Mass are needed.

Study Trips: A trip to a Jewish synagogue would be ideal as students learn the history of the Jewish people.

Projects: Newspaper, scrolls, rewriting the Ten Commandments from another viewpoint.

Enrichment: Stewardship/Service requirements, service learning.

Remediation: Usually some extended time lines or shortened work for those with IEP's.
